Gilbert "Gil" Gregory, Sr., 93, of Calvary Fellowship Homes, was freed from his earthly body when he met Jesus face to face on Wednesday, March 29, 2023. Born in Baltimore, Maryland, he was the husband of the late Nancy (Schaeffer) Gregory who passed away on March 7, 2017. Gil graduated from The King's College with a Bachelor's Degree. “ When I was about 7 years old (c1959) Uncle Gil was the weeklong speaker for the Halethorpe Community Church’s summer children’s camp at Mountain View Bible Camp. I realize that memories from so long ago and from when one was so young, are notoriously unreliable. However, I think I have this story pretty accurate as I’ve been telling for at least 50 years and it has been a part of my testimony as a follower of Jesus Christ all that time.

On a night near the end of the week at camp, after sharing God’s Word with us, Uncle Gil gave a unique invitation to all of us campers. He challenged us to make a commitment that if, as we grew up, God so lead us to serve Him in vocational service as a minister or missionary, that we would be obedient to that call. I went forward that evening.

Years later, as I was finishing my first year as a public school teacher, my pastor asked me to come on board as a part-time youth pastor and, as it turned out, to serve as part-time teacher/administrator in our christian school.

I didn’t want to do it. I was pretty sure I would be more secure financially pursuing a career in public education (that turned out to be correct). I wasn’t excited about the inevitability that I would eventually need to seminary if I took the steps my pastor was proposing.

But I remembered the step of faith and the commitment that my Uncle Gil had led me to make some 18 years before. However, I thought I might have an out. During a few years from 9th through 11th grade I had aborted/suspended my commitment to follow Jesus in favor of trying my hardest to be cool, an effort at which I failed miserably but not for lack of trying.

I reasoned that my rebellion invalidated the commitment I made as a mere 7 year old and disqualified me from vocational service. But I did pray about it and God wasn’t having any of it .

God used Uncle Gil in many ways in my life even though I only saw him a few times a year. He was an amazing example of a servant and follower of Christ. He showed me a lot of attention and his unique brand of love as I grew up. He gave me some pretty good advice over the years. But most importantly, God used my Uncle Gil to plant the seed that God desired to plant so as to prepare me to accept the call on my life that He had foreordained before the foundation of the world.

Thanks Uncle Gil for committing a whole week of your summer to take a few dozen little elementary kids seriously and to teach us concerning the important things of God.

I'm praying for my cousins and their families just now, because if he had this impact on me, how much more has he influenced each of them? And how much more will they miss this quiet, funny, sincere, uniquely compassionate, wise man that they call Dad, or Granddad or whatever their unique relationship suggested, and whom I called Uncle Gil.
