Mildred M. Wimer, 84, of Lancaster, passed away Tuesday, June 23, 2026, at Penn Medicine, Lancaster General Hospital. Born to the late Wilbur E. and Lillian C. Musser, she was married to the late Melvin C. Wimer for 14 years until his death in 1991.

Millie was a J.P. McCaskey High School graduate. She participated in community organizations, including the Order of the Eastern Star, the American Business Women's Association, and the Red Hat Society.

Millie was known for her beautiful singing voice and was a member of many professional church choirs. She performed with the Wheatland Chorale, Lancaster Symphony Chorus, Church of the Apostles and Highland Presbyterian Church choirs.
